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## Grand Traverse Area Trails Network

The trails in the Grand Traverse region are among the most picturesque in the state and one of the best ways to experience the stunning beauty of this popular tourist destination.

This regional network of trails was developed and continues to grow under the care of Traverse Area Recreation and Transportation (TART) Trails Inc. Through the work of this group, and their many volunteers and sponsors, the Grand Traverse Area Trails Network continues to grow every year...

In 2016, the Sleeping Bear Heritage Trail was extended another 3 miles from Port Oneida Road to Bohemian Road.

The final 1.5 miles of The Boardman Lake Trail, along the western shore from 14th Street to Logan's Landing, has received state funding and should begin construction this year, including two new bridges over the Boardman River at Logan's Landing.

The first seven miles of the Boardman River Trail (hiking and mountain biking) has been completed, connecting Mayfield Pond Park to the North Country Trail at the Muncie Lakes Trailhead. When finished, the Boardman River Trail will connect with the southern end of the Boardman Lake Trail and make a 42-mile loop along the Boardman River to Mayfield and circle back to the TART trail through the VASA Pathway.

The group is current working on acquiring right-of-ways and funding to build a new trail connecting the TART trail system in Acme with the Little Traverse Wheelway in Charlevoix.
