## Grand Haven/Spring Lake/Ferrysburg Trail Network

The tri-cities of Grand Haven, Spring Lake and Ferrysburg offer an extensive network of paved paths and bike lanes interwoven throughout these communities. Spend a sunny day or weekend exploring the area's beaches, bayous, lakes, rivers, parks, and local attractions. In Grand Haven, you'll find easy access to the **Grand Haven Waterfront Trail** at Grand Haven State Park and public parking areas along the waterfront.

### Lakeside Trail

When you cross over the north side of the US-31 drawbridge, the trail system connects with the 15-mile Lakeside Trail, which encircles Spring Lake through the communities of Ferrysburg, Fruitport and Village of Spring Lake. Trails in the Village of Spring Lake also lead to the new North

Bank Trail and the Grand River Greenway Trail with views of the Grand River.

### North Bank Trail

The first 3.3 miles of the North Bank Trail was completed in 2011, starting at Central Park and traveling east through a scenic landscape of blueberry fields, woodlands and marshes. Construction is currently underway to extend the paved trail to Nunica and should be completed by July 1.

### Spoonville Trail

Named after a ghost town that once stood at the mouth of Crockery Creek on the Grand River, the first 1.8 miles of the Spoonville Trail was opened in 2016. This first phase of the trail goes from North Cedar Drive to Leonard Road, crossing

the Sgt. Henry E. Plant Memorial Bridge. Construction should begin this summer on two more miles of trail from Leonard Street to Nunica. When completed, it will create an important link between the North Bank Trail and Grand River Explorers Trail.

### Grand River Explorers Trail

Construction was completed in June 2018 on the first 3.9 miles of the Grand River Explorers Trail from Conner Bayou to Riverside Park. This is the first phase of a 30-mile paved trail from Grand Haven to Grand Rapids that Ottawa County Parks officials hope to complete within the next 5 years.
